The Lebanon FFA chapter has continued its long tradition of providing

students with opportunities to develop skills in leadership, agriculture, and community service this past year. We have been able to expand our program by adding a third full time agriculture teacher and FFA advisor, Marcella Cadle. With that addition we have a record number of students enrolled in the ag program and FFA Members. We currently have 229 FFA members within our program.

We kicked off 2023 with a bang heading to Oklahoma and Northern Texas on our Industry Tour Trip. We were able to take several students to see the historic downtown Oklahoma City Stockyards and the Cattlemen's Congress which is a large cattle show where producers from all over the United States bring cattle to compete. We traveled to Texas to tour Terry Bradshaw's Quarter Horse Ranch which was an amazing experience in itself. We had a huge surprise when Terry Bradshaw and his wife made an appearance. It was great to see them interact with the kids and open to answering their questions about his involvement in the cattle and equine industry along with football. Last Spring we had several members participate in Career Development Events which showcase their knowledge learned in ag classes. We had seven teams compete at district level which includes: Dairy Cattle, Livestock, Poultry, Farm Management, Floriculture, and Meats. Three teams qualified for State Competition. These teams included Livestock Evaluation team, Ryder Meckem, Reed Milliken, Stephine Self, and Kaden Roberts, poultry team including Marissa Gress, Alayna Meckem, Jaylie Williams, and Jayden Williams and the Farm Man-

> agement Team, Ella Johnson, Tory Miller, Hayden Starnes, and Hannah Curtis.

Students track their FFA involvement, their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) and leadership throughout high school to earn their State and American FFA Degrees. We had 4 students earn their State degree: Lanie Milliken, Kaylee McDermott, Gracie Uder, and Ryder Meckem. This fall we had 6 students earn their American FFA Degree which is the highest degree a student can earn in FFA. Those earning their degree are: Haley Bakeberg, Emma Beal, Selby Miller, Taylor Miller, Mary Looney (Uder), and Emily Waterman. Students also showcase their SAE through Proficiency awards. Kaden Roberts was able to compete on the state level with his Swine Production Entrepreneurship Proficiency award this past spring. A few members showcased their speaking talents at the Fall area contest: Brynn Kasten, Elisha Dickens, Nora Mitschele, and Ryder Meckem, with Emily Hopkins and Alayna Meckem moving on to compete at the district level. We welcomed new members with an ice cream social and trip to Ozark Farm Fest. Our fall activities included parade participation, hosting a softball tournament, and our major Labor Auction fundraiser, which raised over \$20,000 this year. We appreciate everyone that supports our chapter through our largest fundraiser of the year. These funds help pay for events and trips that we have students attend throughout the year. We appreciate the continued support of all community members and partners!
















